Dear Sir Madam

I have emailed RVS solicitors yesterday, and they sent an auto-responder with my message. Today I rang their receptionist who says you will reply. The message is about applying for a standard visitor visa to the UK to see my 90+ father before he dies. The message is as follows, highlighted in lightblue

The message was:

My name is mohini Hersom. My date of birth is 28th August 1958. I am living in Dublin. In 2022 I was given permission to remain and refugee status in Ireland. I am extremely unwell at the moment and not getting enough medical attention. I've been staying at the same address for two and a half years I am registered disabled. I have a very nice boyfriend in the UK and he will have me and would like me to visit the UK. My parents live in the UK and in 2022 my mother died I've been refused a visitors we started the UK in 2022 and one more time in 2023 I have a trumped-up criminal conviction called her "harassment without violence" initiated by my sister Viju Wortley. Her husband works in the Atomic Establishment Stephen Wortley my parents have lived in the UK on a wealth retirement visa since 2006

During my 14 years in the UK most of the time starting from 2000 specs was spent with Alex McDowell and he is a wonderful and the loyal friend a deeply miss him and would like to give him a hug. As things keep on changing my father tell this getting worse and he lives alone in a five bedroom house hardly able to walk. He is completed 90 years and doctors of told him that he doesn't have long to live. My father is a bit awkward about my sister and he is a very old and apparently she has the right to decide if I will enter the UK ever and she decided I will never enter the UK

I would like to reapply for visa which Alex will pay for if a lawyer consists it to be feasible The criminal conviction which took place in 2013 was trumped up and they did not get appealed rights. I do not have any conviction before that or after that and I never contacted my sister because they have an injunction not to contact her which they plan to keep for life Now I have been into the internet and found in 2013 several individuals in the UK who completed sentence or homicide were given indefinitely to remain in the UK on grounds of being attached to their children

While I do not have children I have a very nice man in the UK who will be happy to see me and I also have a physics degree from the UK which is from 1983 In the light of the new situation where my health has deteriorator and my father has come to live I would like a lawyer to explore the possibility of of applying for a visitor's visa If there is a simpler method then doing a judicial review the lawyer must advise and see if he/she can do the application.

SINCE I WROTE THIS MESSAGE THERE IS AN EMERGENCY WHICH IS HELPED BY GENERAL LAW NOT IMMIGRATION LAW. I SPEAK TO MY FATHER DAILY AND FOR THREE CONSECUTIVE DAYS HAS NOT ANSWERED HIS PHONE. HE LIVES ALONE AND I AM NOT SURE IF HE IS DEAD. MY SISTER WONT TELL IF DAD HAS DIED.

THE Gps RECEPTIONIST SAID SHE WILL KEEP MUM IF MY FATHER DIES IF I CANT CONTACT MY SISTER. I FOUND THE Gps AT THEALE MEDICAL CENTRE AN INDIAN LADY AND AN ENGLISH LADY DOCTOR BUT CANT FIND THEM NOW. I FEEL THEY WOULD BE MORE EMOTIONALLY MATURE THAN AN OFFICE SECRETARY. MY DAD IS NOT AT THE ONLY HOSPITAL HE USUALLY GOES TO. THE BASINGSTOKE POLICE SAID IN JANUARY THEY WONT DO A LIVE AND WELL CHECK ON MY FATHER IF HE IS STAYING WITH MY SISTER UNLESS I SWEAR MY SISTER IS A RISK TO MY FATHERS LIFE. THE MAYOR OF TADLEY -HIS WIFE ANSWERED THE PHONE SAID THE MAYOR IS HONORARY AND CANNOT DO ANYTHING.

I WANT TO FIND OUT IF MY FATHER IS ALIVE AND IF NOT CAN I GO TO ENGLAND FOR HIS FUNERAL
