- (b) provide the Upper Tribunal with a written statement of when and how this was done. You can use form UTIAC2 to do this.

It is important to do this because it tells the other party about your application and tells us that you have made the other party aware of the application.

IF YOU DO NOT COMPLY WITH (A) AND (B) ABOVE YOUR APPLICATION FOR JUDICIAL REVIEW MAY BE STRUCK OUT. If you need more time you will need to make a (paid) application for extension of time.
